Who can participate?

- Aged 21 to 85 years old
- Not previously treated for the Hepatitis C virus (HCV)

How to participate:

- Just show up during testing hours with a quick sign up
- The entire process takes less than an hour

Hep C Screening FAQS

What does participation involve?

- Attend a one-off screening session and complete a rapid HCV test (gum/saliva swab) administered by a trained professional
- Fill out a short survey (approx. 20 minutes)
- Receive your test results in about 40 minutes physically, through email or sms
- Optional referral letter for further follow-up if there is a reactive test result

What are the benefits of participating?

- Free HCV screening (worth approx. SGD50)
- Contribute to research that may help improve community health

Privacy

- Your participation is anonymous.
- We will be collecting survey data and questions may touch on sensitive topics - you can skip any questions and your data will not be linked to any personally identifiable information

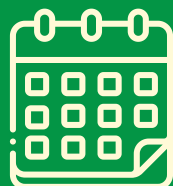
How do I sign up?

- receiving test results physically, through email or sms



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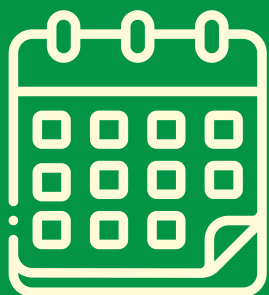
